## COURSE OVERVIEW

Child abuse and trauma in the U.S. and globally is on the rise, and so is the need for highly skilled individuals in Occupational Therapy who are trained to effectively treat a child living with the effects of trauma, violence, or neglect. The Level 1: Occupational Therapy Attachment and Trauma-Focused Trainings a peer-developed, expert-led professional program offered by the Association for Training on Trauma and Attachment in Children(ATTACH).

This Level 1 online training initiates the bridge for those in Occupational Therapy with the education, training, research, and resources needed to offer trauma informed care in pediatric occupational therapy. This workshop is the first tier of coursework to be completed for trauma and attachment in OT. As such it would be the requirement to enter the second tier discussing assessment more in-depth, and the third tier which will focus on intervention.
