Dr. George Thompson is a visionary child psychiatrist with over 30 years of experience helping children reclaim trust, dignity, and self-mastery. A national leader in trauma-informed systems, he co-authored Working with Relational Trauma in Children's Residential Care and Polyvagal Theory and the Developing Child. His work integrates neuroscience and deep clinical insight to design healing environments where even the most wounded children can thrive. Dr. Thompson is co-founder and Chief Medical Officer of Velocity, a new psychiatric residential center near Springfield, Missouri. He serves as Chair of the Polyvagal Institute's Board and core faculty in its certificate course. He also supervises adult and child psychiatry residents at the University of Kansas School of Medicine.
